Dan Smith was born on 2-2-1953 in Buffalo, NY to James and Irene Smith. He joined big brother Ron and his younger brother Gil would come along years later. Dan graduated from the State University of New York at Fredonia as a music major. He registered as a conscientious objector of the Vietnam War. He attended Princeton Seminary and was ordained in the Presbyterian Church in June of 1978. He served the First Presbyterian Church of Geneva NY before coming to the West Hollywood Presbyterian Church in June, 1984. Within a year of starting this great parish, the AIDS crisis came and overwhelmed the congregation. Dan led the congregation through "thick and thin" for 35 years before retiring February 29, 2020. In April of 2022 he was able to move to his "Dream Home" in Cathedral City California. He enjoyed more than one year of freshly squeezed OJ from his tree, Saturday nights free from sermon-anxiety, and many dinners with his friends in the desert. He was predeceased by his parents Irene and James and his brother Gil. He is survived by his brother Ron and his sister-in-law Karin Ziegler. He has four nephews, Brett (married to Ilana), Joshua, James, and Lucas, and two nieces Shanelle (married to Abed), and Gabrielle. He has one great nephew Jace and two great nieces

Remi and Jasmine. He was loved and respected by many and will be missed by all of his family, friends, and congregants.
